The Public Draft Housing Element, an update to the County's General Plan, is available for public review and comment. The draft Housing Element update will identify and analyze existing and projected housing needs in order to preserve, improve, and develop housing for all economic segments of the community, and demonstrate how the County will accommodate its fair share of regional housing needs. The Draft Housing Element update includes a Housing Program, which establishes goals, policies, and implementation programs to address the County's housing needs through 2014.
